


Where do we tend to address these problems they mention if we don't lead with a look at these ordinances? What are our concerns about these problems?

- We collectively give a voice to false assurance wrongfully—take away Christ's voice
- Multitude of dividing lines
- With our own fences that are supposed to protect God's lines these become more important than God's lines
- How long do we put off the awkward conversations as people work/serve in the Church

Where do we tend to address these problems they mention if we don't lead with a look at these ordinances?

- We wait until <u>extreme</u> abuse
- By giving the main voice to the people without the structure of church
- What we value, both about God AND about healthy Christianity or living
- Without asking "Why?" in line with God's means of discernment or counting the cost
- Wrong usage of "right accountability means"
- Apart from defining the character of God—therefore, looking to make church attractive apart from fellowship with God





Thoughts on Spurgeon's practice and perhaps some of the implications we should note as we consider shifts in the norm for churches/Christians today?

- Used to praying
- Used to being examined
- Tight connection between regeneration and accountability and primary sphere of ministry (mission)
- Discernment valued we call it judgment & that is shunned
- Credible profession of faith
- Baptism tied with membership
- Took steps toward fencing these ordinances with confidence
- Each part (membership, Lord's supper, baptism) needs to be carefully explained, understood, and "lived"
- Personal responsibility | Corporate responsibility
- Be careful about how we define these terms & give them out
- Dangerous with too much choice
- Careful teaching before & along the way

"In baptism, you publicly commit to Christ and his people. Baptism is where faith goes public. It's how a new believer shows up on the world and the church's radar as a believer. In other words, baptism marks off a believer from the world. In baptism, the church says to the world, 'This one belongs to Jesus!' In the Lord's Supper, we renew our commitment to Christ and his people. But, distinct from baptism, the Lord's Supper is something we all do together. The Lord's Supper marks off an entire group of Christians as one body, drawing a line between them and the world around them. And by drawing a line between the church and the world, baptism and the Lord's Supper draw a line around the church. The ordinances make it possible to point to something and say 'church' rather than only pointing to many somethings and saying 'Christians.'"

- Sacrifice time, preferences, time displaying what has been given/honed
- Normally, we find gifts, plug people in
- Scripture calls us to stimulate others to good deeds
- Prayer
- Service demands patience

- What does Numbers 4:1ff, 16-19, 22ff, 29ff., Romans 12 do for guiding our service inside the church?
- Temporary, so repetitive, specific
- Assigned
- Leaders/ Servants
- Prescribed order w/ serious consequences
- Deviating from responsibilities brings consequences
- Part of whole part is NOT whole
- Show up (be on duty, be where God is working)
- Called to do (reasonable service) NOT what you get out of it
- Rom. 12 must be personally applied and held accountable
- Balance all service tied to Rom. 12:1-2

What does Numbers I Peter 4:7-11 do for guiding our service inside the church?

- V.7 In the sphere of prayer (communion)
- V.11 God words/strength for Godly service
- V. 1 Arm yourself with the same purpose as Christ – suffer, you are in a dangerous situation, pay attention
- V. 12 Conflict & our response test our faithfulness in service
- Need character to head this way this character must come from yielding to the Spirit

- What causes Burnout:
 - Self-sufficiency
 - Earth bound goals
 - Overwhelmed by world
 - Identity with present circumstances rather than faithfully owning our part in God's Work
 - Disenchanted from wrong expectations (i.e. repetition of ordinary)

Through the lens of these two goals, what were some of the changes hoped for by intentionally changing the goals during our *Future Grace* study leading to an 8 year study of that book? (longer studies over the years preceding)
