- Instead of our eyes wandering for hope in face of failure, find hope that God wants to work these things in my life & ask Him to do His desire

- Someone who cares about God's opinion
- Someone tired of focus on me want a pure faith
- Tired of sin dominating picture
- For those who don't want to waste life
- Someone who cares about God's purposes for us
- Those who want more than bragging rights or respect from their great knowledge
- Those who are tired/want to finish/short-sighted
- Someone free from looking to themselves for perfection or for standard for results

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b. Being short-sighted leaves you doing the wrong things.

At the same time they also learn to be idle, as they go around from house to house; and not merely idle, but also gossips and busybodies, talking about things not proper to mention.

1 Timothy 5:13

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How does this happen?

- Living outside boundaries of normal Christian living
- Forgot most important commitment and that relationship with Christ is the ultimate priority
- If not pursuing what God has will be building something else, therefore minor sins lead to larger sins
- Lack of Biblical discipleship—not tied together with those tied under Christ
- Choices strengthening something/weakening something else
- Lack of clear biblical mission
- Audience that hasn't valued the process of biblical discipleship
- Concerned about things world values info, quick judgements, sensitivity...
- Desires/dedication, pledge encompass whole life therefore, if not growing with God's standard of growing, then wrongfully focused
- Intentions aren't enough either building one side or the other

What would be required to live doing the right actions found in I Timothy 5:9-16?

- Must value knowing Christ and doing what He is doing living relationship
- Apply what He is like to our situations (Phil. 2:1ff)
- Hebrews 12:1-4
- Position under Christ
- Content with lot in life
- They have been trained, disciple, transformed by Christ among the people of God
- Gifts are not focused rather love for Christ
- A higher calling an eternal perspective
- Everything we do is modeling a way of living what are we saying about Christ and His body

"But I tell you that every careless word that people speak, they shall give an accounting for it in the day of judgment.

If you are unable to perceive and therefore discern correctly, what will characterize your spiritual life and subsequent actions?

- Unproductive and cause harm
- Right or wrong motives, wrong actions
- Whatever sometimes good, sometimes not
- Lack of evidence of yielding to the Spirit perhaps no Spirit
- Not Christ or gospel

Our people must also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, so that they will not be unfruitful.

While trusting Christ for justification and His work of sanctifying us frees us from final wrath/judgment, our fellowship with God is still broken when we live with known sin. But we must also remember that God's name is dishonored when we live with unknown sin.

- Rom 4:18-20 lifting up the promises of God
- By periodic spiritual check-ups that looks for which of these is missing because healthy growth will have these flowing from + building on each other
- Look for evidence that the change/work done is result of look beyond ourselves and immediate results (faithful <u>and</u> joyful service)
- First direction we head when trying to grow in these shows source i.e.) prayer dependence – shows where help comes from and who we are seeking to please
- Looking to grow in humility are you praying for this
- Proverbs 2:4 fervor, zeal, work—that life FILLED with this characteristic in looking for God's kingdom purposes throughout our day—preparation in this vein

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
