Baptism is what marks out Christians and divides them from the world. It symbolizes our spiritual unity in Christ and brings visible unity to Christ's church, Therefore, if you want to publicly identity with Jesus, water baptism is the way." "The abiding principle is this: the church has the responsibility in baptism to testify to a person's faith. The church does not have the power to confer or complete salvation. However, it does have the delegated authority to baptize believers in Christ based on their visible faith . . ."

"In baptism, you publicly commit to Christ and his people. Baptism is where faith goes public. It's how a new believer shows up on the world and the church's radar as a believer. In other words, baptism marks off a believer from the world. In baptism, the church says to the world, 'This one belongs to Jesus!' In the Lord's Supper, we renew our commitment to Christ and his people. But, distinct from baptism, the Lord's Supper is something we all do together. The Lord's Supper marks off an entire group of Christians as one body, drawing a line between them and the world around them. And by drawing a line between the church and the world, baptism and the Lord's Supper draw a line around the church. The ordinances make it possible to point to something and say 'church' rather than only pointing to many somethings and saying 'Christians.'"

"There's a gorgeous simplicity to God's design for the church. What does it take to make a church? Gospel preaching that creates gospel people who participate in gospel ordinances. The church is the shape into which the gospel and its ordinances form God's people. Baptism binds one to many, and the Lord's Supper binds many into one." Baptism and the Lord's Supper inscribe the gospel into the very shape and structure of the church. What makes many one are the signs of the gospel. When Christians come together to form a church, they aren't moving beyond the gospel but deeper into it."

- It would foster questions about essence of church & Christianity
- Helps breathe intended life into God-ordained means of identity and sanctification
- Anything significant requires clear boundaries and goals; must identify and seek evidence of Christ's Headship in the church
- Simplifies so can focus on main things
- Freedom to live as Christ intended
- Fuel conversations that remind us about what our Christian life is about that help maintain our relationship with God
- Involved in something much larger than us

- Iron sharpens iron Heb. 3:13, Rom. 15:1-7 forces us to own the faith and personalities of these believers God has placed with us
- Affects how we present the gospel
- Gives us a history
- Forces us to continue to hold up God's words and to seek to honor (it matters)

What does hypocrisy and nominalism do to the strength of the gospel and the trustworthiness of God's Word? What effect would this have on those trying to be faithful to the gospel?

- Weakens it
- Holy Spirit for our purposes and producing ungodly actions instead of our yielding to spirit (we move, not God)
- Look inside ourselves for something different
- Makes it easier to distort
- Create unnecessary barricades around gospel
- Assurance to those who shouldn't
- Adds fear to saying it's wrong
- Changes the definition because lost the center
- Make us concerned about "hearing His voice"
- God allows things that test our faith
- Hypocrisy produces distrust watch danger of trusting your own judgement as final

What effect would this have on those trying to be faithful to the gospel?

- Should make you more dependent on God because you are affected by the disease you see around you – trust His sovereignty
- Should be slower to put foot down as final
- Makes it harder to clarify what is right and wrong
- Adds fear to saying it's wrong
- Faithful will look twisted/false
