Salvation: How & Why?

Ephesians 2:8-10 Sunday AM, June 18, 2023

Prelude — Scripture: Ephesians 2:1-10 (NASB95) And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, 2 in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest. But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, 2 even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), 4 and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 4 not as a result of works, so that no one may boast. 8 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehanded on the true would walk in them.

Overwhelmed with God's gracious goodness, Paul finishes Ephesians 1 offering a prayer of thanksgiving to God for these saints at Ephesus. I praise and thank-you God for your great and gracious mercies toward these believers. Help them see more of these blessings so they will be faithful to Your purpose for calling them. Help them not only see this purpose clearly, but upon seeing the human impossibility of faithfulness to that plan, help them see "the surpassing greatness of [Your] power toward us who believe." What kind of power? The kind that raised Jesus from the dead and seated Him in heaven to rule. The power by which He is head, ruling over His people, the church. This focus on Christ for worship, life, and direction is NOT natural. Two weeks ago, we saw natural life lived out from under Christ's authority, lived according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is not working in the sons of disobedience. This shrunk our world to the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind—leaving us focused on protecting ourselves and our personal happiness. And how is this life with its goals and values described? We were by nature, children of wrath—objects of the wrath of God. Why? Because according to the only reality that matters, it is DEAD living—there is separation between us and God and all that results is full of stench and decay. In the face of all this, we heard two wonderful words—But God! And following those words came an amazing description of this God which accompanied His actions toward us. ⁴ But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our transgressions. made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), 6 and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus. Why? 7 so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. How did He do this? Why? Does it have to be fully understood before you acknowledge this is the kind of thing that God does? Praise the wonderful grace of Jesus.

Today, Paul continues this focus on God's grace. ⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, *it is* the gift of God; God gives to us not merely to make salvation possible, but to lead you to trust His words and live inside them. Think on this as you sing this familiar hymn.
