What does hypocrisy and nominalism do to the strength of the gospel and the trustworthiness of God's Word? What effect would this have on those trying to be faithful to the gospel?

- Weakens it
- Holy Spirit for our purposes and producing ungodly actions instead of our yielding to spirit (we move, not God)
- Look inside ourselves for something different
- Makes it easier to distort
- Create unnecessary barricades around gospel
- Assurance to those who shouldn't
- Adds fear to saying it's wrong
- Changes the definition because lost the center
- Make us concerned about "hearing His voice"
- God allows things that test our faith
- Hypocrisy produces distrust watch danger of trusting your own judgement as final
- Nothing but disconnects you from the power of the gospel

What effect would this have on those trying to be faithful to the gospel?

- Should make you more dependent on God because you are affected by the disease you see around you – trust His sovereignty
- Should be slower to put foot down as final
- Makes it harder to clarify what is right and wrong
- Adds fear to saying it's wrong
- Faithful will look twisted/false
- Extra work to check into things/ fight cynicism and thoughts that nothing is solid
- Makes evangelism harder calls for more precision
- A need to defend the gospel because of honor for author of it

How do we change? How SHOULD we change? (What's involved with biblical change that often gets overlooked in our change?)

SHOULD:

D0:

- By falling down failing, knocked from our stability
- Focus on ourselves with our growth; based on what is seen often due to external factors
- Responding to horizontal peer pressure
- From purpose other than Christ
- Quick, distracted, temporary, like rubber band
- When it fits, makes sense, benefits us (doesn't bring public shame)
- Stopping short of motives (watch extreme examples of hypocrisy keeping us from process of change
- Independent means of change (before Lord/other)

- Read & Do the word of God
- Examining roots of conflict to see values/loves
- Bond slave seeking to serve, know His will, looking beyond just rote commands as we obey to honor
- Dying to self in our growth outside examination
- Examine roots of wrong change
- Examine presence of God's tools for change
- From purpose: Christ
- Slow, rooted
- Be thankful for small but real change
- Get used to Gal 6:1-3; Rom 13:8; Rom 12
- Sometimes (consequences process) will be drastic Heb.12:5-10
- Glean from people we respect how much II Tim 2:15; Ps 1 mediate on His law day/night
- Might appear backwards I Cor 1
- i.e.) shouldn't feel hopeless as "Christian" when we sin/fall I Pet5:6-7; I Cor 17
- Must include will, mind, emotion, spiritual

Underlying Assumptions/Goals in Adult SS for church as whole:

- 1. We must shift our focus from personal maturity and growth to building healthy churches.
- 2. We must focus on the roots, not merely the fruit.

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IF we do NOTHING else together, the Collective People of God must:

- I. Worship God Together. Romans 15:5-6
- II. Grow Individually and Corporately with a Growth that Comes from God. Eph. 4:15-16
- III. Protect/Defend the Name of God—His character and Eternal Purposes. II Tim. 1:13-
- IV. Own the People in the Particular Expression of the Body of Christ where God has Placed you. 1 Cor. 12:18, Eph. 4:16
- V. Spread the Glory of God Hab. 2:14, I Pet. 2:9

We have looked at public worship services, relationships, growth, culture, now finally, What would need to be lifted up/allowed if want to build healthy churches with strong roots in faithful service?

Through the lens of these two goals, what were some of the changes hoped for by intentionally changing the goals during our *Future Grace* study leading to an 8 year study of that book? (longer studies over the years preceding)
