How do YOU handle sin?

If you are not studying God and His gospel to the depths of sin's destruction, then reminders of sin's presence and devastation will overshadow the power and purposes of God over those sins.

While trusting Christ for justification and His work of sanctifying us frees us from final wrath/judgment, our fellowship with God is still broken when we live with known sin. But we must also remember that God's name is dishonored when we live with unknown sin. How should those fighting spiritual short-sightedness respond to the reality of sin displayed through our lives?

- Willingness to see where we are not right teachableness to be shown over long period of time
- Acknowledge sin with constant focus on the work of the cross
- Gospel should make us secure enough to desire to be exposed
- Recognize gift of eye of the group/God
- Free from being crippled
- Confident that God is working good through imperfect people
- Secure in riches of God's kindness to us as deal with sin
- David acquit me of hidden faults welcomed Lord's provision

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- **IV.** Lived with His Calling in View vv. 10-11
 - A. Maintenance in line with God's calling protects from eternal devastation.v 10

What does calling/choosing imply? Where does focusing on calling and choosing lead you to focus?

- Ahead, moving
- He wants you
- Focus on One choosing you
- Resulting emotions: gratitude, security, humility
- Not random, there's a plan
- Do something <u>with</u> the calling
- Not what we choose so focus on the One who called and His calling
- Code of conduct with calling
- Security in God's character and faithfulness and His provision for calling
- Implies decision
- Security

just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we would be holy and blameless before Him. In love Ephesians 1:4

yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach—

Colossians 1:22

"... but as He called us to the end that we may be pure and spotless in his presence, then "purity of life is not improperly called the evidence and proof of election, by which the faithful may not only testify to others that they are the children of God, but also confirm themselves in this confidence, in such a manner, however, that they fix their solid foundation on something else."

John Calvin

This work to maintain what God has said is your identity and calling gives a firm foundation/assurance so you are free to obey from where you are right now, resulting in growth in these character qualities. Li ve these character qualities in light of your Col. 3:12, II Pet. 1:3 identity. What would this focus do for your everyday living?

- Sweet aroma of Christ comes as we live/go/obey
- Prove true faith, work true faith
- Example Israelites forgot identity as people of God care and protection from ownership – came from lack of remembering which led to not knowing which led to not doing/obeying His word/will
- Heb. 11-12 (12:1) note all the examples of faith set aside (the sin that entangled) to gain what was precious
- Makes us more aware of need for these character qualities

"God's grace should not lead to moral relaxation but intense effort."

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We do not preach election to unsaved people; we preach the Gospel. But God uses that Gospel to call sinners to repentance, and then those sinners discover that they were chosen by God! . . . Where should the promise of v. 10 lead us when we find ourselves overwhelmed by doubts, instability, feelings of worthlessness, or lack of purpose?

- Practice these things
- Re-examine what it means to fall (our own dreams, falling, failure, unfulfillment)
- Make a clear line between 2 kingdoms (God & self)
- What is the "more" we live for versus the "more" He prescribes
- Recognize "we lose" when we don't honor His Word don't have to stumble
- Nothing do or don't do makes us more accepted we are accepted based on work of Christ therefore discipline not punishment, but opportunity for growth
- Lead us to look for evidence of what is "not natural" changing as sign of assurance that I'm connected to God to His promises
- Should lead to life of confidence do this
- Lead to the basics : why? God | What? What He designed us for? Eph 2:10 | How? By His Spirit Rom 8:17 through His Word

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 - B. Our confidence lies with a hope that is personal and always lies ahead. V. 11

Where does verse 11 focus and what does it give you?

What fights against our hope lying ahead and faith looking forward

How would we focus our energies on these character traits in a way that would evidence the work of God—a result of faith, meaning effort IN God's presence? What might that include OR what would be signs our growth is NOT a result of God's power or inside living relationship with God?

- Rom 4:18-20 lifting up the promises of God
- By periodic spiritual check-ups that looks for which of these is missing because healthy growth will have these flowing from + building on each other
- Look for evidence that the change/work done is result of look beyond ourselves and immediate results (faithful <u>and</u> joyful service)
- First direction we head when trying to grow in these shows source i.e. prayer dependence – shows where help comes from and who we are seeking to please
- Looking to grow in humility are you praying for this
- Proverbs 2:4 fervor, zeal, work—that life FILLED with this characteristic in looking for God's kingdom purposes throughout our day—preparation in this vein

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
