YOU CAN TRUST GOD'S WORD PT. 3

II Peter 1:16-21

- I. What you have been given is precious and is under attack. v. 12
 - A. The gospel is sufficient. Stay focused there!
 - B. The gospel has been lived. Live it now!
- 1. Can you articulate the gospel?
- 2. Are you conscious of how that gospel affects each moment of each day of your life?
- 3. Can you identify other gospels that daily threaten the gospel?

False teaching is only dangerous because you WANT it. It feeds some need/desire causing you to drift away from living the words you SAY you believe to follow similar teaching that gives you what you value more than God's provision through Christ to bring glory to Himself through your building His kingdom instead of yours.

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- II. Time is Short. vv. 13-14
- III. Maintain gospel-driven life for the rest of your life. v. 15

- I. There are trustworthy witnesses testifying God's actions in history. vv. 16-18
 - A. God has given trustworthy witness of what is to come.

"But immediately after the tribulation of those days THE SUN WILL BE DARKENED, AND THE MOON WILL NOT GIVE ITS LIGHT, AND THE STARS WILL FALL from the sky, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. 30 "And then the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the SON OF MAN COMING ON THE CLOUDS OF THE SKY with power and great glory. 31 "And He will send forth His angels with A GREAT TRUMPET and THEY WILL GATHER TOGETHER His elect from the four winds, from one end of the sky to the other. Matthew 24:29–31

"But when the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne. 32 "All the nations will be gathered before Him; and He will separate them from one another, as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats; Matthew 25:31–32

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 - A. God has given trustworthy witness of what is to come.
 - B. God has given credible witnesses to His redemptive activity.

"Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."

Matthew 16:28

And Jesus was saying to them, "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the kingdom of God after it has come with power."

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 - A. God has given trustworthy witness of what is to come.
 - B. God has given credible witnesses to His redemptive activity.
- II. There are trustworthy messengers testifying to the veracity, perspicuity, and sufficiency of God's word. vv. 19-21
 - A. Scripture IS God's Word.

Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, 2 which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, 3 concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, 4 who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord, 5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for His name's sake,

Romans 1:1-5

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 - A. Scripture IS God's Word.
 - **B.** Live God's Word.

Can you think of hindrances to paying attention to God's Word this way?

- Don't see it
- I see another Light (lost in the descriptive words)
- Settling for less than transcendency
- Own finite minds limiting
- Cultural/political rubric instead of God's own witness
- Looks like following God but missing God who is beyond our own loves & agendas
- We are the "gods" through who's lens we interpret the Word
- Failing to see greatness & goodness of God in revealing Himself to us at all Rom 1
- Don't love God enough to see supremacy of Christ. ~Heb.12:1-2
- Sloppy with listening, interpreting and not thinking deeper about context of these words

We must not in practice deny our allegiance to the authority of the Word of God by saying we believe it while continuing to live according to what is right in our own eyes.

- **■** Divine:
- See power of God to work in individual lives
- Head covering
- Perhaps not relate to Scripture

- Human:
- Can discount the writer's opinion as opinion
- Forget God used people
- Pick and choose what you want

- Intentionally in communion with God
- Keep us from living without hope (i.e. Bogged down by sin or circumstance) by making us look beyond (frees from stuck or disappointment)
- Keep us from merely looking to scripture to solve problems or to give "blessing for today"
- This focuses on what happens after this life is over beyond today and our life and this world
- Fuels perseverance by giving joy Heb. 12:1-3
