#### Ephesians 4:22-24 Sunday AM, October 29, 2023

Prelude – Scripture: Ephesians 4:17-24 (NASB95) So this I say, and affirm together with the Lord, that you walk no longer just as the Gentiles also walk, in the futility of their mind, 18 being darkened in their understanding, excluded from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the hardness of their heart; 19 and they, having become callous, have given themselves over to sensuality for the practice of every kind of impurity with greediness. 20 But you did not learn Christ in this way, 21 if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught in Him, just as truth is in Jesus, 22 that, in reference to your former manner of life, you lay aside the old self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, 23 and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, 24 and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth. Walk worthy of the calling to which you have been called. You are to do this inside relationships starting with those others God has called to Himself. God provides all necessary to fulfill your calling. Put to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. But we don't determine our own service for God. God graciously gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers for God's goal of equipping each saint for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ; until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. These goals keep us from aimless wandering because of different voices of truth with different goals. We grow to the fullness of Christ by speaking the truth in love leading to each member carrying out their part of the growth of the body under the headship of Christ. There is life, love, and above all, growth among the people of God when Christ is given His position as Head of the c

### Offering: \*Doxology:

Today, we focus on the work resulting from learning Christ. We lay aside the old self, the part corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit. This means real desires, but wrong desires. Those desires eat away at us, even when we think we want God, and keep us focused on either getting those desires fulfilled or wallowing in the hopelessness of never achieving them. And all this misses the new self, the one which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth. THIS put off, put on is the focus of each Christian. Ray Orlund and Sam Allberry's new book, *Your Not Crazy*, speaks to the reality that "While we're quick to assert what the gospel says, we're often too slow to admit what the gospel should do for our churches: reflect Christ's beauty through a godly, grace-filled culture." In order to reflect Christ's beauty, we must see it. Look at Him—not for anything other than than for the beauty of His holiness.

You may be seated. Do you feel weird saying that God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is beautiful? What was the divinely inspired David seeing as he sought to bring the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem and called on all to give thanks to the Lord, call on His name, and make known His deeds among the peoples? The promises/covenant to Abraham renewed to Isaac and Jacob were not merely for them but were a covenant which included promises to a thousand generations?!? The powerful God described by David, the One we are to worship in holy array, the splendor of holiness—He is the One enabling you to put off, put on. This is the One to whom you pray as you fight the sin which so EASILY entangles making you doubt God's promises and the sufficiency of His provision for you to carry out His will willingly and joyfully. To live the reality of the Headship of Christ by the power of the Spirit is to say with the choir, There is no other refuge can save, Lord but Thee—Oh Rock of ages, hide Thou Me. As pastor prepares to preach on your responsibility, think on God's provision for you to be in fellowship with One so holy as Himself.
