### A Serious Consideration

### Ephesians 5:3-6 Sunday AM, December 17, 2023

Prelude — Scripture: Ephesians 5:1-6 (NASB95) Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; 2 and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma. 3 But immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints; 4 and there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. 5 For this you know with certainty, that no immoral or impure person of covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. 6 Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience.

Life and change mark true believers, direct results of the gracious work of God to use individuals to display His love to the unlovely and His power to change the unchangeable. Christians under the Headship of Christ are not unstable and distracted, tossed . . . by waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming, following different voices with different goals. They are not dependent on the futility of their own minds and therefore darkened in their understanding, excluded from the life of God because of the hardness of their hearts. Instead, they are purposeful in their work among the people of God, speaking into each other's souls with the goal of each growing in ALL aspects into Christ. While the growth WILL be noticed, the saving difference of this change will be internal as God works through the personal work of the Holy Spirit showing us the greatness of God's love on our behalf. This leads to treasuring God's commands as we see not only His care, but provision for us to change. Remember the command from last week? Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; 2 and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us. Loving others THIS way demands a change of focus—not at them, look not to yourself, not at them, but look to God and imitate Him as you love. God has given many examples of His love for His wayward creation, but during this season, we look at God's final work of redemption as we celebrate the first Noel. This familiar carol tells the story of His birthday! Church, sing with joy as personal recipients of His coming!

This coming and giving Himself up for us was an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma. God was pleased with what Christ came and did. What did Christ do? He loved you. Do you see this as personal? You must, or you have no part in Him. Those who have a part in Him will also willingly seek to do what is pleasing to God. What are we to do? Be imitators of God as beloved children and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us. Contemplate carefully what this means and doesn't mean. Imitating will cost. To continue imitating will seem impossible. You won't continue unless you see priceless value in His love for you. Ponder once again God's love for you in Christ.

If so, you WILL seek to imitate His love, and our passage today shows us what that love must include. 3 But immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints; 4 and there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. 5 For this you know with certainty, that no immoral or impure person or covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. 6 Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. To take this seriously cuts against our attempts to define love for God on our own. You don't determine morality or value—He does. Your desires don't determine life's purpose, His do. This is so nonnegotiable that those who continue in these patterns will not have an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. This makes us uncomfortable, and it should, and yet, how can we profess belief in God and not obey Him. He is God. When you feel caught in the web of, "I should feel grateful but I'm not. I know He loves me, but I want to be loved differently. What if my dreams are crushed under His plans for me and I never desire to do His will," you start to see why you can't get to right relationship with God on your own—why this love relationship is originated by God even while you must accept it individually. As Pastor Jahn tackles this passage, remember that wrestling with all these pieces is part of the process, but you aren't to wrestle alone. Fix your eyes on Jesus and He will give rest to your soul.
