

Discipling, Evangelism, Raising up leaders, Church Planting, Missions. What is the root of these five things (the "germ" he talks about)?

What does it require to find what God values and does and then fill your life with more of these things?

- Being thankful
- In & under His Word
- Submission & humility
- Honoring His work in creation & sustaining
- Habits of Grace reading Word, meditating, prayer, fellowship of saints are not the end – we sink our roots into Him & spread branches out in service which drives us back to learn more of Him (need Him to serve Him)
- Matt. 6:33 what does seeking look like? Knowing only part of picture get wisdom & understanding (effort involved in bridge between facts & apprehension application)
- If "know more" than those around, then lose desire to learn more

What does it require to find what God values and does and then fill your life with more of these things? CONTINUED

- No growth if not identifying sin & enjoy the benefits of confession through Christ
- Discipleship process that includes all God intends to work in our lives
- Trust Christ to separate you from your sin (cleanse us from all unrighteousness)
- Rom 5:8 God demonstrates His love, while still sinners Christ died for us I John 4:19 He Love because He first loved us
- Meditation Ps.1 day & night explaining to myself the truth I just read, I find must struggle more to understand

What does "being a disciple"/following imply or necessitate?

- Seeing He is enough
- You are learning
- Something outside; willing to lose self-centeredness
- Share what learn/not embarrass
- Shows level of importance
- Doer not hearer
- Intentional (discipline required)
- Wisdom of God lifted up (head, heart, hand)
- Looking past brokenness, solutions, why look to Him, what do you want
- Not co-pilot or business partner more like apprenticeship i.e.) one who left Jesus in John 6 left b/c looking through their lens/needs
- Seek maturity, don't focus on age don't hide flaws

What does "being a disciple"/following imply or necessitate? CONTINUED

- Phil. 2 no selfish ambition, the mindset of Christ Jesus
- Know Him; passion
- Contrast seeing what not; teachable to be lead toward object your following
- Willingness to do the hard things often things we haven't thought of that indicates something outside ourselves we value
- Preventative maintenance
- Romans 12

If we believe all of God's words in the midst of hard things, what will it keep us from?

- Sinning being separated from God
- Doubting His Word
- 2 Peter 1 character that continues "in Christ" will not be useless, unfaithfulness
- Consequences
- Hebrews in obedience you will see that He is better
- Keep our eyes off ourselves, not losing sight of who God is
- Idols, going our own way

What does this say about our following Jesus if we are not actively helping others follow Jesus?

- We don't get it
- My kingdom, masquerading as God's Kingdom causing me to miss God's priorities
- We have selective faith take parts we want ignore parts don't think we need
- Fear of people holding us to same standard
- Lazy caught up in our own kingdom (schedule, family)
- We don't see Jesus or "all things whatsoever He commanded" as worthy of sharing with others
- Perhaps shows we don't love people as we ought
- Shows we don't value growing "in all aspects to Him who is the head" Eph. 4, Rom. 8:29

What does this say about our following Jesus if we are not actively helping others follow Jesus? (CONTINUED)

- Disobedience
- Intentional, won't come naturally
- Find benefits of "product" (benefits of knowing Christ)
- We have different priorities in following Him

What is the progression in 2 Cor. 5 (page 1 of 3)?

- Rom. 8 chain Justification, Sanctification, Glorification
- Life with Christ because body dead, 6 therefore's
- Comparing earthly life with heavenly life v. 1-5, Therefore must walk by faith, in earthly because will be judged in heavenly, therefore live pleasing to God v. 6-10
- **1**. Groaning in contrast with longing based on promise of God
- 2. We are all preaching something about what will make life work when it is the gospel, it will minimize other priorities
- Everything here is a picture of something heavenly something much greater in heaven with Jesus – we flip it and put our hope in earthly
- V. 10 anchors what is on display (v. 11-13) and how you respond under scrutiny

What is the progression in 2 Cor. 5 (page 2 of 3)?

- V. 11 fear of the lord not a terror but delight and full reference point leads to how and why I interact with others
- We affect one another and so should be willing to give account for our actions respecting God
- What does being in the presence of "holy God" mean for NOW
- V. 14 love of Christ always there when all else falls away
- Don't have a good understanding of God's love, but we have very great pictures (John, Moses, lay down you life)
- Opportunity for Jesus as Savior instead of judge as motivator (as hope, as security of belonging, of welcome)

What is the progression in 2 Cor. 5 (page 3 of 3)?

- If Christ is author of new identity (new belonging/love), then no connection w/ old
- vv.18-21 responsibility has been transferred (continued) from Christ to us
- v.20 "mouth piece" of God result of new identity (relationship)
- Timidity resulting from not having a "Paul" experience shows don't understand path of appropriating gospel and its necessary outcome (mission)
- v.16 Christ seen in new way spiritual Vs. flesh we must do the same
- New vision for how we see these crowd us and Christ this directs our journey (mission)

What does making disciples of Jesus include?

- Making sure you yourself are a disciple
- Engage people intentionally
- Teach people what Jesus said
- Love souls
- Be careful of cloning ourselves a slow process, soil how are we cultivating soil that seed is growing in
- Ask, "Why do we want to make disciples?"
 - **1.** Commanded
 - 2. Why would we want to follow Jesus? (Establishing Value)
- Learning under God to follow Jesus then helping others to follow Jesus
- Share gospel with them

What does making disciples of Jesus include? - cont.

- Trust/allow Spirit to work with seed of gospel
- Asking what does God want them to hear/seeking
- Continued growth with encouragement
- Trust God obedience
- Acknowledging to be a disciple
- Sense of need and desire for change
- Identify areas that need to be strengthened while we work & watch for work of God to take hold (firm foundation)

What does making disciples include? Colossians 1:28 - 2:7

- Struggle
- Evidence of dependence in struggle
- Motivating them to do work of building/encouraging
- Striving against what we used to protect/defend from being disciplined
- Point to Christ Himself, not just change behavior
- Protect from wrong doctrine
- Continuing to "own" responsibility for their continued stability and growth in the gospel
- Making your presence & intention felt
- Includes specific goal knit together in love

What does making disciples include? Ephesians 3:14, 16-17; 4:14-19

- Being stabilized in love
- First salvation, and then what does it look like for them to come to the completion of Christ
- In order to head this way, must understand love (we struggle, stroke one another, etc. - because so afraid we won't seem loving); therefore pray for growth in love of God
- Rejoicing/thankful in process with them (means noticing image of God, steps of growth)

What does making disciples include? Galatians 4:10-20

- It includes heartbreak
- At times being seen as an enemy
- Continuing after them pursuing , vying for affection

Underlying Assumptions/Goals in Adult SS for church as whole:

- **1.** We must shift our focus from personal maturity and growth to building healthy churches.

- I. Worship God Together. Romans 15:5-6
- II. Grow Individually and Corporately with a Growth that Comes from God. Eph. 4:15-16
- III. Protect/Defend the Name of God—His character and Eternal Purposes. 11 Tim. 1:13-14
- IV. Own the People in the Particular Expression of the Body of Christ where God has Placed you. 1 Cor. 12:18, Eph. 4:16
- V. Spread the Glory of God Hab. 2:14, I Pet. 2:9
