You Don't Want to Miss It

Ephesians 5:15-17 Sunday AM, January 7, 2024

Prelude — Scripture: Ephesians 5:7-17 (NASB95) Therefore do not be partakers with them; 8 for you were formerly darkness, but now you are Light in the Lord; walk as children of Light 9 (for the fruit of the Light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth), 10 trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. 11 Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even expose them; 12 for it is disgraceful even to speak of the things which are done by them in secret. 13 But all things become visible when they are exposed by the light, for everything that becomes visible is light. 14 For this reason it says, "Awake, sleeper, And arise from the dead, And Christ will shine on you." 15 Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, 16 making the most of your time, because the days are evil. 17 So then do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; 2 and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us. Loving others THIS way demands change of focus—from them, from yourself to God. To imitate His love necessitates constantly looking to Him—studying His love even as you have a growing awareness of being a recipient of this great love. This love is a love like none other. How do we know? It was pleasing to God—an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma. Do YOU care to be pleasing to God? Then look to God and imitate Christ's love—yes, what you've studied/pondered/worshipped, but our passage goes on to show additional identifiers of this love. No immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be named among you, no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting. Why? Because these things don't fit in God's kingdom—practice these and YOU are take part in not only what is excluded, but elicits God's righteous wrath. Shudder, fight to get away from these things, but also, run toward what you have rightly learned. If saved, you are children of light. You are not the light, but are Light in the Lord. Therefore, walk as children of Light—look to the One who is Light and follow. What does walking in light include? 9 (for the fruit of the Light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth), This negatively means that you will not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead, will expose them. But you don't merely uncover the wrong, your life is FILLED with one focus—10 trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. This is not merely an intention, a desire, it is a way of life. Sing this disposition.

This way of life necessitates careful attention. There is much to remember and live leading our passage to remind us to be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, 16 making the most of your time, because the days are evil. 17 So then do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. But you aren't to do all this alone. You are imitating Christ. He, the holy One calls you the unholy to continue to look to Him—why? Yes, to imitate, but also because He is the enabler! He is able first to make you holy through His redemptive work on your behalf so He can be with you and not against you, but He also daily gives all needed to fight everything not holy so God is seen in the world through you. All your hope to be with God AND pleasing to God comes from fixing your gaze on Christ. Continue to learn this song of perspective and testimony with me.

Proverbs 1 speaks to the heart of wisdom. 5 A wise man will hear and increase in learning, And a man of understanding will acquire wise counsel. Are you wise in this way? We look not merely for wisdom, but wisdom sourced in the fear of God. God is not merely the center of our religion, He is the source of all—all life, all truth.
