- Indignation / boiling rage / anger
- Go into survival mode
- This would fill your gaze, either cave or resolute to survive/pick apart

But what SHOULD be astonishing?

- That God is working (He is caring for me/providing)
- That people should/will be able to trusted God & endure through it
- God did it and part of His trustworthy word & righteous character
