### That You May Know

### Luke 1:1-4 Sunday AM, May 19, 2024

**Prelude – Scripture:** Luke 1:1–4 (NASB95) Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile an account of the things accomplished among us, 2 just as they were handed down to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, 3 it seemed fitting for me as well, having investigated everything carefully from the beginning, to write it out for you in consecutive order, most excellent Theophilus; 4 so that you may know the exact truth about the things you have been taught.

And so we move to another book of the Bible—when is the last time you read Luke? Where are you reading right now? And what do you hope to see—something interesting? Something helpful to live by? Is there connection between what you read and your growth in the fear of God? God is present and acting inside history. We behold the works of God now based on what those God ordained beheld but then recorded for us to behold so we might believe. Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile an account of the things accomplished among us, 2 just as they were handed down to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, In the gospels, we have eyewitness accounts of Jesus—God's final word and confirmation of His promises to deliver His people from their sins and reconciling them to Himself. To know the gospel is to praise God for Jesus. Church, lift your voices to exalt

There should be emotional involvement in your relationship with God, but there is also careful study of the events and facts so that we have a solid basis for our faith. Ponder these simple four verses at the beginning of Luke and think of the treasure, the value of the subject as events were compiled, investigated carefully, and put in order. Who is this Jesus of whom these gospels speak? As you sing, remember that this One we speak of as so close is holy. He is God. Marvel at His condescension and worship.

Scripture: Psalm 78:1—39 (NASB95) I Listen, O my people, to my instruction; Incline your ears to the words of my mouth. 2 I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings of old, 3 Which we have heard and known, And our fathers have told us. 4 We will not conceal them from their children, But tell to the generation to come the praises of the LORD, And His strength and His wondrous works that He has done. 5 For He established a testimony in Jacob And appointed a law in Israel, Which He commanded our fathers That they should teach them to their children, 6 That the generation to come might know, even the children yet to be born, That they may arise and tell them to their children, 7 That they should put their confidence in God And not forget the works of God, But keep His commandments, 8 And not be like their fathers, A stubborn and rebellious generation, A generation that did not prepare its heart And whose spirit was not faithful to God. 9 The sons of Ephraim were archers equipped with bows, Yet they turned back in the 4 yof battle. 10 They did not keep the covenant of God And refused to walk in His law; 11 They forgod His deeds And His miracles that He had shown them. 12 He wrought wonders before their fathers In the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan. 13 He divided the sea and caused them to pass through, And He made the waters stand up like a heap. 14 Then He led them with the cloud by day And all the night with a light of fire. 15 He split the rocks in the wilderness And gave them abundant drink like the ocean depths. 16 He brought forth streams also from the rock And caused waters to run down like rivers. 17 Yet they still continued to sin against Him, To rebel against the Most High in the desert. 18 And in their heart they put God to the test By asking food according to their desire. 19 Then they spoke against God; They said, "Can God prepare a table in the wilderness? 20 "Behold, He struck the rock so that waters gushed out, And streams were overflowing; Can. He give the desert wind to be a
