What do you wish your children would do in their response to you when they don't understand or when things seem unlivable or unfair?

- Listen, trust, and do
- Trust that I am working for their flourishing, not demise.
- Another perspective, another person with pressure, another need.
- There's more and I might have some of that more.
- Not create massive scheme based only on their reality
- Initiate dialogue rather than shut down
- Talking from prosecutor position or disgruntled employee.
- Not see whole mountain of problems as a whole responsibility apart from provision and wisdom
- Look through another's eyes including another role with more responsibility than you have

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What would be required to get our answers to our questions about God from God?

- 1. Sit in and under God's Word WHILE in affliction/pressured.
- 2. Widen your circle to include others under God.

Lessons About Faith

- 1. There is more than you can see. Trust the One who sees all.
- 2. Neither you nor they are in control over circumstances. God is. Trust God to undergird and glorify Himself through you by continuing to work and worship while you wait for His answers.

What keeps us from continuing to work and worship while we do the work of waiting for His answers?

- Obsess over situation so there is no more room for the rest of what God is doing
- Needing all of the answers before continuing meaning that our living is based on our understanding before we continue
- 1 John 1 what we have heard, seen, we make known meaning that there <u>are</u> certainties and tasks while there <u>are</u> uncertainties.
- Loss of God's basic character and desires (frozen because all depends on us OR afraid will do "wrong")
- Far from where we started when we came to Christ, meaning we're forgetting impossibility
 of us even receiving anything good from God (i.e. Repentant prodigal son)
- Perhaps not knowing what work IS when God brings great change.
- We don't want to let go of not having the answer
- Our hearts can be divided (distracted by competing values that fight against the sufficiency of God)
- Peace of God is part of sovereign will (His moral will is revealed which is not always valued)
 therefore let your request be made known Phil. 4:6

What keeps us from continuing to work and worship while we do the work of waiting for His answers?

- Desire for better working conditions shows that God is not present and providing which would enable work in all conditions including uncertainty
- FOMO- Fear of missing out
- Failing to do what we know God values
- Listening to poor counsel (what is your rubric for assessing counsel?)
- Is God good? Can I trust Him? These questions seem to rise above rest in slowing down our obedience- part of the answer is continuing with work and worship in place where God proves His goodness/trustworthiness

"All, then, who indulge themselves in their own counsels, deserve to be forsaken by God, and to be left by him to be driven up and down, and here and there, by Satan; for the only unfailing security for the faithful is to acquiesce in God's word."

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 - A. Your obedience to God's Word affects other's faithfulness to God's Word both now and in the future.

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 - A. Your obedience to God's Word affects other's faithfulness to God's Word both now and in the future.
 - B. Your obedience includes waiting with expectancy and continued obedience.

"One of the wonders of Habakkuk's message is the engagement of God with his people. He answered Habakkuk. God dealt with the prophet's complaints and answered his concerns but in an expected way. He began with an imperative, not an indicative, a command to the prophet, not a word for the prophet. Like Job, Habakkuk seemed content that the God of the heavens is concerned with his people and answers from heaven. God's second response is more than an indication of concern; it is the answer for the ages. God is faithful and calls for faithfulness on the part of his people. Still, the answer does not yet address the prophetic questions, just as God's answers never addressed Job's issues."
