- 2. Widen your circle to include others under God.

The prophets had a clear assignment. What is our job in relationship to the work of preserving and heralding God's Word?

- Necessity to give gospel don't mess with it
- 2 Cor. 5 knowing fear of the Lord, we persuade men I Cor. 1 gospel goes
 against natural definition of life think opposition from Jews (God fearers) to Paul in
 Acts we miss signs given to us of Gods mercy that cuts against our self sufficiency
 and pride
- Living life in way that shows impacted by the gospel
- Know words of gospel and those beliefs are highly treasured because we live them
- Continue studying, living, giving word in face of opposition
- 2 Peter 1 if these qualities not yours and increasing... useless and unfruitful watch stale truth
- I Tim 3 know how to conduct self in house of God... pillar of truth

You are our letter, written in our hearts, known and read by all men; 3 being manifested that you are a letter of Christ, cared for by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

2 Corinthians 3:2–3

For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place your faith toward God has gone forth, so that we have no need to say anything. 9 For they themselves report about us what kind of a reception we had with you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God, 10 and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, that is Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath to come.

While we must come to God with questions about His power and providence, what would show a lack of humility and impatience in our requests? (what would show we demand His answer now?)

- When focused on waning trust to neglect of continuing to nurture faith shown by obedience in "the middle" – impatience shows by change of actions.
- When no anchor for emotions, when looking everywhere, but God's not taken seriously (i.e. When Judah told to yield to captors)
- Jonah rather die than yield to God
- Prayer against God's will and nature
- Imagining people/circumstances changing as only way for deliverance
- Worship that centers on our feeling of it experience of worship over God worshipping
- When God on trial and we leave depending on answer instead of seeking to understand – and remaining under

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, 4 who comforts us in all our affliction so that we will be able to comfort those who are in any affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. 5 For just as the sufferings of Christ are ours in abundance, so also our comfort is abundant through Christ.

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A mature faith is one that both sees the issues at hand and yet remains steadfast, living in light of God's providence.
