Luke 2:1-7 Sunday AM, July 21, 2024

Prelude — Scripture: Luke 2:1-7 (NASB95) Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth. 2 This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And everyone was on his way to register for the census, each to his own city. 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, 5 in order to register along with Mary, who was engaged to him, and was with child. 6 While they were there, the days were completed for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son; and she wrapped Him in cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in him.

As we move deeper into this treatise to Theophilus concerning the exact truth of the gospel he had been taught, we've been introduced to God's work through Gabriel's visits predicting two impossible babies. We've seen differing responses from Mary, Zacharias, and Elizabeth, but all lived in the fear of the Lord. This fear resulted not in terror but in praise to God. They lived under God, faithful to God's intent of stewarding the people and parts of creation God had entrusted to them according to His word. And inside this faithful fear of God, God's word fulfilling His promise of a supernatural birth came to pass. Elizabeth gave birth to John! Zacharias' Benedictus, His words of praise to God last week focused not merely on the blessing of John for themselves, but he saw and praised the goodness of God in fulfilling His promise to bring salvation to His people from the house of David. This happening confirmed the words spoken by God's prophets and was in line with His promises to Abraham. When Zacharias can see God's word confirmed again and again through thousands of years, how can he not publicly praise the trustworthiness of God's word and the goodness of God! He has visited us and accomplished redemption for His people . . . AS HE spoke by the mouth of His holy prophets from of old . . . Because of the tender mercy of our God, with which the Sunrise from on high will visit us, 79 TO SHINE UPON THOSE WHO SIT IN DARKNESS AND THE SHADOW OF DEATH, To guide our feet into the way of peace." John would prepare the way for God's salvation in a special way, but we who have our eyes opened by the Holy Spirit to see God's goodness to provide an undeserved way for us to be reconciled to Him must also publicly proclaim the glory of God. Church, praise the Lord!

Offering: *Doxology:

And where does God's miraculous word take place? Right in the middle of struggling world powers. In the middle of conquering and oppression—government and order which includes taxes and a census. Joseph and Mary had claim to a royal heritage, but presently, there was nothing to distinguish them as royalty. They had nothing but the pledge to be married and a job as a carpenter. But they also had something precious and life-giving—trust in God's word! This created more problems for them—how to explain a baby before they were married, but it also provided God's protection and provision and opportunities for them to see the glory of God—for their faith to grow! Isaiah? It speaks of a remnant—those who have escaped. Whom? Assyria—ruthless before Chaldean ruthlessness. And what would those who believe God's word have? Judgment according to God's word because of their disobedience to His word. But then, "My indignation against you will be spent and My anger will be directed to their destruction." The Assyrian burden would be removed from their shoulders. God would deliver them from those who seemed unstoppable. But this promise of deliverance was pregnant with deliverance long in the future. Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse, and a branch from his roots will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on Him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding. What a powerful passage of hope in God's Word. He truly is the holy One—the One above us in every way. Worship His holiness!

You may be seated. So what are your circumstances? Do you look for and tremble at His word right now, where you ARE? We are NOT to have God's vantage point where all is clear and righteous (See bulletin insert and the one from last week). From our vantage point, life seems shrouded in uncertainty, even questions of unrighteousness like we've seen from Habakkuk. Feel the emotion that comes from uncertainty and injustice, but when you do it under God's holiness, you can also see His hand. Look, in the darkness/time of pain, fog, brokenness, judgment, there comes a light. Grow to say with the psalmist, Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word Ps. 119:67. Therefore, Ps. 119:37-38, "Turn away my eyes from looking at vanity, and revive me in Your ways. Establish Your word to Your servant as that which produces reverence for You." Think on the mysterious ways of God's work as Pastor preaches.
