

"Links can be found with Paul's opponents at Corinth, with Cerinthus, and with Ignatius's opponents. It seems most likely that the opponents were Christians who felt that they had moved beyond the elementary stages of orthodox theology to a new position which called orthodox affirmations into question. They were like men kicking away the ladder on which they have climbed to the heights and leaving themselves without any visible means of support. Relying on their belief that they were inspired by the Spirit and claiming a direct knowledge of God, they thought that they no longer needed Jesus or his teaching. Under the influence of Docetism they argued against a real incarnation of the Son of God in Jesus, and probably adopted a view like that of Cerinthus or Basilides, that the Christ or Son of God inhabited Jesus only for a temporary period.

Probably Weiss goes too far in saying that they attached no significance at all to Jesus; it is more likely that he had a nominal importance for them. On the whole, then, a combination of reliance on spiritual experiences and a Gnostic type of world-view led the opponents to a form of Christianity in which Jesus Christ no longer occupied a central position."

How does Jesus lose the central position as Living Head in our lives and the life of the church specifically with our worship and service for God?

- Still struggle with feelings in our experiences of worship and service—feel it is not worth it if don't feel that it is worth it
- Feel our worth tied to what we do; what does growth mean? Shun certain things, embrace certain things; growth in knowledge, in giftedness for service—all of these things can lead to the temptation to need Him less; easy to shift focus from Him; IF regularly confessing sins, SHOULD be before face of God; Holy Spirit should remind us of source of identity with God
- Social issues that are rooted in the gospel can become bigger than the gospel;
- Easy to look to be fulfilled by worship and service instead of a Christ-centered gospel that ends with treasuring all Christ is for us leading to worship and service
- Trials/tragedies can lead toward less dependence on Christ
- Content with the form without the substance—even content knowing we are not properly centered/motivated; effort/spiritual character II Pet. 1 is too much

What pieces are involved (have weight) in deciding who is right in truth wars among professing Christians?

- Sometimes scared by complexity—this will hinder us getting deeper into the truth; however, we might follow someone into complexity when there are more touchpoints with Scripture (complex—made up of multiple parts)
- Who we are listening to (often listen to those with whom we align in other areas); what makes logical sense to us
- Often start with ourselves as the "piece that is right" -
- Parts of our theology that are incomplete—would rather have incomplete puzzle than jam in pieces that don't belong (knowing when this is an interpretation versus when this is a final word)

What keeps us from coming back to these eyewitness accounts of One who was from the beginning as the final source of truth and life? Why are we so susceptible to similar but wrong teaching about this God?

"Though from John's point of view truth would by no means be antithetical to much of what naturalistic science affirms today, it would be markedly less reductionist. Truth is as much a matter of what God, by word or deed, in creation or redemption, has revealed as it is of what humans observe and infer. Ideally, divine revelation and humble human inference work together, and when they do, truth in a full sense can emerge. Precisely this concurrence of divine self-disclosure and human reception is what John writes about here as he 'testifies' or 'bears witness.'"
