Luke 11:27-28 Sunday AM, October 12, 2025

Prelude - Scripture: Luke 11:14-28 (NASB95) And He was casting out a demon, and it was mute; when the demon had gone out, the mute man spoke; and the crowds were amazed. 15 But some of them said, "He casts out demons by Beelzebul,

the ruler of the demons." 16 Others, to test Him, were demanding of Him a sign from heaven. 17 But He knew their thoughts and said to them, "Any kingdom divided against itself is laid waste; and a house divided against itself falls. 18 "If Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? For you say that I cast out demons by Beclzebul. 19 "And if I by Beclzebul cast out demons, by whom do your sons cast them out? So they will be your judges. 20 "But if I cast out demons by the finger of God, then kingdom of God has come upon you. 21 "When a strong man, fully armed, guaresh his own houses, his possessions are undisturbed. 22 "But when someone stronger than he attacks man of your powers him, he takes away from him all his armor on which he had relied and distributes his plunder. 23 "He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me, scatters. 24 "When the unclean spirit goes out of a man, it passes through waterless places seeking rest, and not finding any, it says, 'I will return to my house from which I came.' 25 "And when it comes, it finds it swept and put in order. 26 "Then it goes and takes along seven other spirits more evil than itself, and they go in and live there; and the last state of that man becomes worse than the first." 27 While Jesus was saying these things, one of the women in the crowd raised her voice and said to Him, "Blessed is the womb that bore You and the breasts at which Vou nursued." 28 But He said, "On the contrary, blessed are those who heart the word of God and observe it."

Last week, we praised God because He freed a man from the power of a demon! While many gave glory to God, some attributed this compassionate display of power to the devil while others want more miraculous proof that it truly was a work of God. What more could Jesus do to show His power was greater—that HE was greater, that He was God?!? And yet, worship the compassion of Jesus as He engaged their arguments, For you say that I cast out demons by Beelzebul. 19 "And if I by Beelzebul cast out demons, by whom do your sons cast them out? So they will be your judges. 20 "But if I cast out demons by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. He gave them something to think about, but in the end, Jesus must be the final interpreter of all they see—"He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me, scatters. We must admit both our blindness and our need of Him. Praise God for the gift of the Holy Spirit promised earlier in this chapter to those who humbly ask for Him. Only God by His Spirit can break our darkness so we can SEE His ordinary as well as extraordinary means of grace and attribute them only to Him. Praise God's love to provide a way for our eyes to be opened and be justly reconciled to Him.

And he said, "Here I am." 12 He said, "Do not stretch out your hand against the lad, and do nothing to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me." 13 Then Abraham raised his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him a ram caught in the thicket by his horns; and Abraham went and took the ram and offered him up for a burnt offering in the place of his son. 14 Abraham called the name of that place The LORD Will Provide, as it is said to this day, "In the mount of the LORD it will be provided." 15 Then the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven, 16 and said, "By Myself I have sworn
